### INTRODUCTION AND READ FIRST TIME

The President laid before the City Council the following bills and resolutions for first reading:

**Bill No. 04-1405** - By President Dixon (The Administration):

An Ordinance increasing the annual registration fee for vacant lots; defining and redefining certain terms applicable to the registration of vacant lots; modifying certain terminology applicable to late payments of license or registration fees for vacant lots, rental properties, or multiple-family dwellings and rooming houses; correcting, clarifying, and conforming certain language; and generally relating to the licensing or registration of certain properties.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Finance, Board of Estimates, Taxation Committee.

**Bill No. 04-1406** - By Councilmember Garey (by request):

An Ordinance approving the application of Harbor East Parcel D-Hotel, LLC, and Harbor East Parcel D-Residential, LLC, collectively the developer of certain property in the Inner Harbor East Urban Renewal Area identified as Parcel D and consisting of approximately 2.31 acres, more or less, to have that property designated a Business Planned Unit Development; and approving the Development Plan submitted by the applicant.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Public Works, Fire Department, Baltimore City Parking Authority, Department of Transportation, Land Use and Planning Committee.

**Bill No. 04-1407** - By Councilmember Reisinger (by request):

An Ordinance changing the zoning for the properties known as 1901 Light Street, 1921 Light Street, bed of Johnson Street, and Block 1947, Lot 1, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat, from the M-3 Zoning District to the R-8 Zoning District.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Land Use and Planning Committee.

**Bill No. 04-1408** - By Councilmembers Reisinger, Garey (by request):

An Ordinance approving the application of Mark Eisenberg, L-A Investment Acquisitions, LLC, Ossani Investments, Inc., and the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, which are the owners or contract purchaser of 1901 Light Street, 1921 Light Street, bed of Johnson Street, and Block 1947, Lot 1 (collectively, the "Property"), to have the Property designated a Residential Planned Unit Development; and approving the Development Plan submitted by the applicant.

**Bill No. 04-1409** - By Councilmembers Stancil, D'Adamo, Young, Branch, Holton, Mitchell, Spector, Welch, Abayomi, Pugh, Curran, Harris:

An Ordinance repealing the prohibition against riding bicycles on sidewalks and footways; conforming related provisions; and generally relating to the regulation of bicycles.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Department of Finance, Police Department, Transportation Subcommittee.

**Bill No. 04-1410** - By Councilmembers Curran, Welch, Abayomi, Harris, Holton, Garey, Carter, Spector, Stukes, President Dixon:

A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council authorizing the use, under certain circumstances, of competitive sealed proposals in procurement; defining certain terms; conforming, correcting, and clarifying certain language; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the City for adoption or rejection.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Department of Finance, Board of Estimates, Bureau of Purchasing, Judiciary and Legislative Investigations Committee and Economic Development Subcommittee.

A Resolution reaffirming the Baltimore City Council's commitment to public access television and democratic, grassroots, media access for all individuals living in Baltimore City by ensuring that public access television will be adequately provided for in the new cable

television franchise agreement now being negotiated and by determining that provisions to guarantee ongoing financial support for public access television throughout the term that the agreement remains in effect will be included in the agreement to be signed in December 2004.

A Resolution supporting the American Friends Service Committee and the Partnership for Social Justice in requesting the Maryland Delegation to the 108<sup>th</sup> Congress to call for a Congressional hearing into the covert operations of COINTELPRO; the impact of COINTELPRO on the organizations and individuals who were victimized over 30 years ago through the obstruction of their human and civil rights; the impact of the more recently enacted USA Patriot Act on organizations and individuals who have come under similar scrutiny; and legal redress for victims of both of these intrusive operations.

A Resolution requesting the Interim Director of the Baltimore Department of Social Services and Members of the Social Service Commission to share with the City Council the Department's efforts to address continuing personnel shortages, technological inadequacies, and fiscal constraints that interfere with the mission of safeguarding children within the system and reaching children and families that should be monitored by social service professionals; to report on efforts to coordinate services with local agencies to increase the effectiveness of existing programs; and to submit to the Council a plan to ensure that no more of our children are neglected, abused, or murdered.
