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**INTRODUCTION AND READ FIRST TIME**

**BILL NO. 04-1419 REPORTED FAVORABLY  
AND ORDERED PRINTED FOR THIRD READING**

Councilmember Garey, for the Land Use and Planning Committee, reported that the Committee has complied with the requirements of Article 66B of the Maryland Code and recommends the adoption of the following Findings of Fact and the adoption of Bill No. 04-1419 favorably.

An Ordinance changing the zoning for the property known as 700 South Caroline Street, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat, from the M-3 Zoning District to the B-2-2 Zoning District.

**Findings of Fact**

**City Council Bill No. 04-1419  
Rezoning - 700 South Caroline Street**

**1. Boundaries of the Neighborhood:**

The boundaries of the neighborhood are approximately Pratt Street on the north; Northwest River Basin on the south; Bond Street on the east; and West Falls Avenue on the west.

**2. Population Change:**

Since the enactment of the 1971 Zoning Code, the number of residents in the geographic area of Ward 3, Precinct 3, has increased by 8 percent.

**3. Availability of public facilities:**

Adequate public facilities are available for office and residential activity.

**4. Present and future transportation pattern:**

Since the enactment of the 1971 Zoning Code, traffic patterns have changed substantially but can accommodate office and residential activities.

**5. Compatibility with existing and proposed development:**
