A COUNCIL RESOLUTION CONCERNING

Community Schools – Let's Implement Strategies Now

FOR the purpose of calling upon the Baltimore City Administration, the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, and non-profit education related organizations, with the support of parents and students, to implement the Community Schools Strategy to enhance the future of Baltimore by providing its children and their families with highly supportive, full service community schools that aid in learning, strengthen families, and help to build healthy communities.

Recitals

Education reform has focused on the effectiveness of instruction and the efficiency of administration. However, if the students are not physically and emotionally present and ready to learn, these hard-fought efforts are wasted. Schools are only as strong as the communities and families they serve, and communities cannot thrive without stronger families and higher quality schools. In this age of accountability, schools can no longer be blamed for the failure of education; the community must share the responsibility and the accountability for student success.

Schools and communities around the country are building sustainable partnerships to bring community resources into the school, turn the school into a responsible community resource, and engage students in the life of the community as a text for learning. Models and approaches abound; there are important lessons that have been learned and skills that can be taught. Baltimore has some schools with services for children, but the approach remains haphazard and dependent on the approach of a particular administrator. Even where a school is relatively “service-rich”, the absence of coordination and planning renders these efforts less responsive, less effective, and often transitory. There are even more schools and communities prepared and interested in developing partnerships, but without the knowledge or resources to move forward.

Over the last 3 years, stakeholders have been attending community school conferences where they learned about the many different strategies on how to utilize community efforts to create a better learning environment for students. Presently, Baltimore has 22 schools that have utilized some aspects of the community schools strategy. Now is the time to capitalize on those and then turn them into full community schools.

Statistics from around the country show that the public supports Community Schools. In a recent poll of Ohio citizens, the KnowledgeWorks Foundation found some interesting statistics:

- 91% favor comprehensive after school programs
- 84% favor community member use of school facilities after school hours
- 62% favor locating community social services for children on school grounds
- 65% favor locating community programs for adults on school grounds
- 72% of Ohioans believe that local public schools will not continue to improve unless citizens get more involved

Community Schools across the United States are improving student learning and strengthening families and communities in a variety of ways. At the Elliott Elementary School in Lincoln, Nebraska, teachers gained between 15 and 45 minutes of instructional time per day thanks to classroom management techniques shared by the staff of a partnering YMCA. Referrals of disruptive students to the principals office decreased by 80% in one year. At the James Otis Elementary School in Boston, Massachusetts, parents who are adult literacy students also take leadership roles within the school as volunteers or paid staff. In 2000, the school led all other Boston schools in improvement on the Massachusetts Comprehensive Assessment Systems Test. These are simple examples of how community involvement in schools benefits students, teachers, and parents alike. Baltimore is ready, the plan is in order, and the time has come to implement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Baltimore City Administration, the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, and non-profit education related organizations, with the support of parents and students, are called upon to implement the Community Schools Strategy to enhance the future of Baltimore by providing its children and their families with highly supportive, full service community schools that aid in learning, strengthen families, and help to build healthy communities.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Mayor, the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the Council, the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners, and the Baltimore City School System, the Baltimore City Administration, and all non-profit education related organizations.
