Pursuant to the authority provided by Article 31, § 2-6 of the Baltimore City Code, I am hereby notifying you of my desire for Administrative Regulation Number 1-2012, which establishes a Reserved Permit Parking Area on the 900 block of Gorsuch Avenue, to become permanent. This regulation states:

ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION NUMBER 1-2012

A Reserved Permit Parking Area, to be known as Area #44, shall be established in the 900 block of GORSUCH AVENUE. Parking restrictions for the South side of GORSUCH AVENUE, from 901 Gorsuch Avenue through 939 Gorsuch Avenue, and the North side of Gorsuch Avenue from 902 Gorsuch Avenue through 626 Gorsuch Avenue, will be posted in the following manner:

Permit Parking Area  
No Parking  
5 p.m. - 10 p.m., Monday - Friday  
8 a.m. - 10 p.m., Saturday & Sunday  
Except with Area #44 Permit

Pursuant to Article 31, § 2-6(3), this administrative regulation becomes permanent if “no written objection is made by the President of the City Council or the Chairman of the Highways and Franchises Subcommittee and forwarded to” me.

**INTRODUCTION AND READ FIRST TIME**

The President laid before the City Council the following bills and Resolutions of the Mayor and City Council for first reading:

**Bill No. 12-0019** - By the Council President (The Administration):

An Ordinance excepting amendments to comprehensive rezoning bills from certain rules that govern amendments to multi-property rezoning bills; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the processing of comprehensive rezoning bills.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Planning Commission, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Baltimore Development Corporation, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Finance, Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0020** - By the Council President (The Administration):

An Ordinance providing that one of the appointments by the City Council President must be a City Councilmember, who need not be a veteran.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Veterans Commission, Judiciary and Legislative Investigations Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0021** - By the Council President (The Administration):

An Ordinance providing that a youth is not qualified for appointment to a term as a voting member of the Youth Commission if that youth would become 26 years old during that term.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Youth Commission, Education and Youth Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0022** - By the Council President (The Administration):

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain properties known as 1801 East Oliver Street (Ward 08, Section 10, Block 1495, Lot 001) and 1731 Llewelyn Avenue (Ward 08, Section 10, Block 1494, Lot 101) and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Public Works, Department of Transportation, Baltimore City Parking Authority Board, Department of Real Estate, Department of Finance, Board of Estimates, Baltimore Development Corporation, Commission on Sustainability, Taxation, Finance and Economic Development Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0023** - By Councilmembers Spector, Henry, President Young, Councilmembers Middleton, Curran, Holton, Kraft, Cole, Scott, Mosby, Welch, Reisinger, Clarke, Stokes:

A Resolution of the Mayor and City Council providing for the election of the Mayor, the Comptroller, and the President and Members of the City Council in 2016 and in every succeeding fourth year; adjusting the terms of office for those elected in 2011; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the City for adoption or rejection.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Elections Supervisors, Department of Finance, Board of Estimates, Judiciary and Legislative Investigations Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0024** - By Councilmember Kraft (by request):

An Ordinance changing the zoning for a portion of the properties known as 1201-1207 Dundalk Avenue (to be known as 1201 Dundalk Avenue), as outlined in red on the accompanying plat, from the R-3 Zoning District to the B-2-2 Zoning District.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Baltimore Development Corporation, Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0025** - By Councilmember Kraft (by request):

An Ordinance permitting, subject to certain conditions, the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a parking, open off-street area on the properties known as 1201-1207 Dundalk Avenue (to be known as 1201 Dundalk Avenue), as outlined in red on the accompanying plat.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Transportation, Fire Department, Baltimore City Parking Authority Board, Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0026** - By Councilmembers Clarke, Mosby (by request):

An Ordinance permitting, subject to certain conditions, the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a second-hand store on the property known as 914 West 36<sup>th</sup> Street, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Transportation, Fire Department, Baltimore Development Corporation, Land Use and Transportation Committee.

**Bill No. 12-0027** - By Councilmember Stokes (by request):

An Ordinance amending the maximum bed capacity for the home for homeless persons on the property known as 1017 East Baltimore Street, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat.

The bill was read the first time and referred to the City Solicitor, Board of Municipal and Zoning Appeals, Planning Commission, Department of Housing and Community Development, Department of Transportation, Fire Department, Health Department, Land Use and Transportation Committee.

## **A COUNCIL RESOLUTION CONCERNING**

### **Congratulations to the Baltimore Ravens**

FOR the purpose of congratulating the Baltimore Ravens on their successes in both the regular season and the playoffs, and expressing the City's appreciation for how their consistent excellence continues to be a great source of pride for Baltimore.

#### **Recitals**

Since their arrival in Baltimore before the 1996 NFL season, the Ravens have been a tremendous source of pride for our city. Baltimore has made it clear how much it loves its team from day 1, and the Ravens have rewarded that love with consistent excellence on the field.

The superb performance of the 2011-2012 Ravens, culminating in the club's 3<sup>rd</sup> trip to the AFC championship game, continues this tradition of excellence. Baltimore has reached the playoffs in 8 of the last 12 seasons, and is the only team to have earned a post-season berth in each of the last 4 years. And once they reach the playoffs, the Ravens always make their presence felt, winning at least one victory in each of the last 4 post-season tournaments.

This year's path to the playoffs included some especially impressive achievements by both the team and individual players. The Ravens simply dominated the best division in football, sweeping the AFC North on the way to winning the division title and the #2 seed in the AFC without losing a single game in Baltimore. Along the way, the defense continued to feature some

of the NFL's all time greats including Ray Lewis and Ed Reed as well as perennial stand-outs Terrell Suggs and Haloti Ngata. The offense was similarly led by stars such as RB Ray Rice, who posted a League best 2068 yards from scrimmage, and QB Joe Flacco, who threw for more than 3000 yards for the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive season - becoming the 1<sup>st</sup> QB in Baltimore professional football history to do so.

These impressive performances were recognized by the selection of 7 Ravens to the Pro-Bowl for their 2011 regular season performances, more selections than any other AFC team except for the Ravens' Conference Championship opponent, the New England Patriots.

Despite the difficult loss to end the season, there is every reason to expect the Ravens' success to continue into the future. Since coach John Harbaugh and QB Joe Flacco joined the team in 2008, the Ravens have the 2<sup>nd</sup> most total wins in the NFL; and Flacco's 44 regular season victories as a starter are the most in NFL history by a QB in his first 4 seasons. This year's team marked a transition to a new generation of Ravens stars as well; only 1 team had more rookies or 1<sup>st</sup> year players on its roster to open the season, and the lessons these young men can learn from the 13 pro-bowlers on the Ravens' roster - including sure future hall-of-famers Ray Lewis and Ed Reed - are clearly being learned and taken to heart if this year's performance is any indication.

**A COUNCIL RESOLUTION CONCERNING**

**Request for State Action - Equal Access to Marriage**

FOR the purpose of urging the Baltimore City delegation to the Maryland General Assembly to maintain the recent momentum toward ending discrimination against same-sex couples and their families by introducing and securing passage of legislation providing for equal access to marriage and all of its legal benefits and obligations for all persons, regardless of sex, gender identity, or sexual orientation.

**WHEREAS**, Maryland is home to over ten thousand same-sex households, many raising children, and all of whom deserve the same rights and legal protections as other families.

**WHEREAS**, The goal of the City of Baltimore and the State of Maryland is, and should be, to protect families and promote household stability.

**WHEREAS**, By denying same-sex couples the ability to legally marry, Maryland systematically denies thousands of families access to the more than 1,138 civil federal rights, protections, and responsibilities automatically granted to married heterosexual couples, as well as the more than 425 civil rights and protections provided by Maryland law.

**WHEREAS**, Providing equal access to these rights and protections is a crucial step toward the protection of Maryland families.

**WHEREAS**, New York recently passed landmark marriage equality legislation, joining the District of Columbia and states such as Connecticut, Iowa, and New Hampshire, and marking a historic bipartisan effort on this important issue.

**WHEREAS**, Recent research has shown that a majority of Americans now support same-sex marriage.

**WHEREAS**, As a state that is committed to equality for all of its citizens, it is Maryland's duty to be a leader on marriage equality, even as this issue gains momentum across the country.

**WHEREAS**, Enacting such legislation would not require clergy or other religious ministers to perform services that would in any way conflict with the tenets of their faith; nor would it prevent a religious or denominational institution or organization from taking such action as it deems necessary to promote the religious principles for which it is established or maintained.

**WHEREAS**, Denial of marriage to same-sex couples is the denial of a fundamental civil right that cannot continue in the State of Maryland.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, that the City Council of Baltimore urges the Baltimore City delegation to the Maryland General Assembly to maintain the recent momentum toward ending discrimination against same-sex couples and their

families by introducing and securing passage of legislation providing for equal access to marriage and all of its legal benefits and obligations for all persons, regardless of sex, gender identity, or sexual orientation.

**AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Governor, the Honorable Chair and Members of the Baltimore City House and Senate Delegations to the Maryland General Assembly, the President of the Maryland Senate, the Maryland House Speaker, the Mayor, and the Mayor's Legislative Liaison to the City Council.

Favorable report adopted.
