The Sixth Amendment to the Land Disposition Agreement between the Mayor and City Council and CBAC Borrow, LLC will formalize the purchase price of the Option Parcel of \$1.25 million per acre and assign the option from CBAC Borrower LLC to 701 West Ostend LLC.

On October 31, 2012, the Mayor and City Council entered a Land Disposition Agreement (LDA) with CBAC Gaming, LLC for the sale of eight city owned lots to be developed into a parking garage for the Horseshoe Casino VLT facility. As part of the LDA, CBAC Gaming also received an option to purchase two other parcels, 701 West Ostend Street and 1411 Warner Street. The LDA was subsequently amended on August 21, 2013, April 20, 2016, June 28,2017, April 11,2018 and March 4,2020 and the rights of CBAC Gaming have been assigned to CBAC Borrower LLC.

Per the terms of the original LDA, the developer agreed to pay the higher of either the appraised value or \$1, 250,000 per acre. An appraisal conducted earlier this year valued the entire property at \$2,730,000, lower than the \$1.25 million set forth in the LDA (the lot is +/- 4 acres).

This amendment will provide for assignment of the Option to 701 West Ostend LLC and settlement will occur within 30 days of Board of Estimates approval.

# BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Plaintiff went to the Baltimore City Community Action Partnership Center ("BCCAPC") on July 31, 2018, located at 3411 Bank Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21224, intending to apply for energy assistance from Baltimore Gas and Electric Company ("B.G.E.") after her service was interrupted. At the Center, the Plaintiff was met by the former employee and escorted to his office. The former employee made comments about her looks, inquired of her relationship status, and asked her to stand. The Plaintiff stood up at which point Plaintiff alleges the former employee reached over the desk and slapped her posterior. The former employee then began to discuss his sexual attraction to the opposite sex. Plaintiff, who has an extensive history of sexual abuse, immediately reported the incident to management at the BCCAPC and took to Facebook Live immediately thereafter to recount the incident without mentioning any names. She explained that she was disappointed that she did not stand up for herself at the time of the incident as that is what she seeks to instill in her daughters. Additionally, during the Plaintiff's Facebook video other women commented that they knew who she was referring to and others even mentioned that they experienced similar treatment at the same center while applying for energy assistance.

Central DHR investigated the Plaintiff's claims. D.H.R. concluded that the former employee engaged in inappropriate behavior and violated the City's EEO Policy (sexual harassment) as well as Civil Service rules. Upon further investigation, it was discovered the former employee had an extensive history of allegations of sexual misconduct including a termination in 2009 for sexual harassment. The OLC ultimately reversed the termination after a Maryland court concluded that the evidence was not sufficient to sustain a criminal conviction. On July 30, 2021, the Plaintiff filed a Complaint in the United States District Court for the District of Maryland requesting a judgment of \$400,000.00. The Parties met on September 9, 2023, for an official settlement conference. The Plaintiff again sought damages of \$400,000.00. After multiple rounds of negotiation, over the course of several days, the Parties agreed to a settlement amount of \$225,000.00 (attorney fees included) subject to Board of Estimate approval.

#### BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Consent Decree between the Mayor and City Council (the "City"), Maryland Department of the Environment ("MDE"), and Blue Water Baltimore ("BWB" regarding both the Back River and Patapsco Wastewater Treatment Plants ("BRWWTP" and "PWWTP" respectively). Circuit Court for Baltimore City – Case no. 24-C-22-000386, U.S. District Court of Maryland – Case no. 1:21-CV-03176

This Consent Decree represents a settlement of certain violations alleged by MDE and BWB regarding the discharge permits issued to both BRWWTP and PWWTP over the past several years. BRWWTP and PWWTP are the two largest WWTPS in Maryland. BRWWTP discharges to Back River through Outfall 001A and to Bear Creek through Outfall 002A. PWWTP discharges to the Patapsco River. The period of this agreement is from November 15, 2023 through December 31, 2027.

Discharge limits for both WWTPs conform to the local Total Maximum Daily Loads("TMDLs") approved by the United States Environmental Protection Agency ("EPA") for Back River and Baltimore Harbor, specifically, the waste load allocations designated for the WWTP outfalls as point sources. Local TMDLs identify other point and non-point sources of the associated pollutants. Waste load allocations for the WWTPs from the local TMDLS were incorporated into "Maryland's Phase III Watershed Implementation Plan (WIP) to Restore Chesapeake Bay by 2025", which included strategies of reducing nutrient and sediment loads from the agriculture, natural, septic, stormwater, and wastewater source sectors. Back River WWTP and Patapsco WWTP are two of 472 municipal and industrial WWTPs in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed, which includes 6 states and Washington D.C. It is important to keep in mind the myriad contributors to the Chesapeake Bay TMDL when discussing local water quality issues, even though the City's WWTP's performances are two of numerous other factors in the overall picture of the Chesapeake Bay.

On January 21, 2022, MDE filed a civil lawsuit in the Circuit Court for Baltimore City alleging that the WWTPs were being operated in violation of their permits. BWB filed a similar lawsuit in federal court on December 15, 2021, making the same allegations. This Consent Decree, though entered in state court, will settle both lawsuits. During the pendency of the lawsuits, MDE and the City also agreed to a Consent Order, which has been amended multiple times, to bring the BRWWTP back into compliance with their effluent limitations, which they have been since June 2022 (with the exception of a de minimis phosphorous excursion at BRWWTP in April 2023). In addition, the PWWTP has been compliant with its daily, weekly,

and monthly effluent limitations since September of 2022 and has been meeting its requirements for Total Nitrogen since January of 2023. Although there is plenty of work to be done, WWTPs' performance has been nothing short of exceptional over the past year and a half. The City has made significant investments in these valuable assets and continues to prioritize improving all aspects of WWTP compliance.

All parties have been working hard to negotiate this Consent Decree for the past two years and believe that it represents a fair settlement of the issues.
