The main driver of this increase is from State appropriations in the amount of \$12,000,000 awarded to the DPOB to continue and increase safety initiatives, and capital improvements within the DMA district. Planned expenses will increase from Fiscal 2023 to Fiscal 2023 to Fiscal 2024 by 103% (\$10,368,499 vs.\$21,021,851).

MCBD will augment this revenue with \$562,263 in grant contributions, interest earned, and service fees. As of March 31, 2023, total cash reserves for MCBD are \$813,116, which meets the desired benchmark for three months of operating expenses.

MCBD provides the Bolton Hill, Charles North, Madison Park and Mount Vernon neighborhoods with enhanced cleaning, safety and maintenance services. These services include daily broom and dustpan services and mechanized equipment along sidewalks, curb lines, and park spaces. Detailed cleaning of alleys; trash collection of 187 cans; weeding; leaf collection; public green maintenance; and increased safety patrols.

Your Honorable Board is requested to approve, with respect to the Renaissance Row project located at 4301 Park Heights Avenue an Omnibus Modification Agreement (or similar agreement) among the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Department of Housing and Community Development, Renaissance Row, LLC, a Maryland limited liability company, and the Community Development Administration ("CDA"), a unit of the Division of Development Finance of the Department of Housing and Community Development, a principal Department of the State of Maryland. The Board is requested to authorize the Commissioner of the Department of Housing and Community Development to execute the Omnibus Modification Agreement to facilitate the increase of CDA's loan by \$766,000 to the property to reflect the award of additional funds project and all legal documents to effectuate this transaction after legal review and sign off by the Department of Law.

Renaissance Row is a newly constructed 84-unit affordable apartment building (the "Development") located at 4301 Park Heights Avenue (the "Property"). The Borrower is Renaissance Row, LLC, a Maryland limited liability company (the "Borrower"). The members of the Borrower are Renaissance Row Managing Member, LLC, a Maryland limited liability company; BAHD Renaissance Row, LLC, a Maryland limited liability company; Hudson Renaissance Row LLC, a Delaware limited liability company; and Hudson SLP LLC, a Delaware limited liability company; The sponsors of Renaissance Row Managing Member, LLC and developers of the project are Pennrose, Inc. and Park Heights Renaissance, Inc. (the "Developers"). BAHD Renaissance Row, LLC is controlled by Baltimore Affordable Housing Development, Inc., an instrumentality of the Housing Authority of Baltimore City.

On May 8, 2020, the Board approved a City Loan in the amount of \$3,150,000 (the "City Loan") to the Borrower, of which \$2,150,000 funded with Affordable Housing Program Bonds and \$1,000,000 funded with Video Lottery Slots Funds. As previously approved, the proceeds of the City Loan financed a portion of the hard construction costs for the affordable apartment building. Of the 84 apartments, the Development includes 42 one-bedroom units, 35 two-bedroom units, and seven three-bedroom units, with eight units reserved for residents with

incomes at or below 50% of Area Median Income ("AMI"), and 76 units at 60% AMI, adjusted for family size.

Since the prior Board approval, construction has been completed, units leased, and the property stabilized. During construction, there were unforeseen conditions, including materials and cost increases due to the Covid-19 pandemic and bad soils, which resulted in substantial additional costs. The Borrower has secured a \$766,000 Construction Relief Fund from CDA which will be added to the principal amount of their existing Rental Housing Works loan in joint second lien position ahead of the City Loan. As a result of this award, the CDA Rental Housing Works Loan will be in the principal amount of approximately \$3,266,000. Otherwise, the terms of the CDA Rental Housing Works Loan are unchanged, with a permanent loan period of 40 years, and principal and contingent interest payments due from available cash flow after servicing the first mortgage in accordance with CDA program requirements and applicable loan documents.

The City Loan is in permanent third-lien position behind the CDA Tax-Exempt Bond Loan of approximately \$6,440,000 (first-lien position), a CDA Rental Housing Program Loan of approximately \$1,200,000 and the increased CDA Rental Housing Works Loan of approximately \$3,266,000 (in joint second-lien position). The approximate amount of Rental Housing Program Loan was described as \$1,133,055 in the prior Board of Estimates approval, but this loan was finalized by CDA in the amount of \$1,200,000 in the loan documents between CDA and the Borrower.

Additional sources include a City Seller Tack-Back Loan of \$588,000 (fourth-lien position), an energy rebate of approximately \$33,600, equity from the syndication of the Low-Income Housing Tax Credits of approximately \$7,259,756, and a deferred developer's fee of approximately \$401,961. BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

The Department of Law respectfully requests authorization to approve the settlement of a lawsuit brought by Sean Lewis, Jr. against Baltimore Police Department Officer Christopher Florio related to the Officer's use of a Taser on Plaintiff, a minor. Plaintiff's complaint included a state claim alleging violation of the Maryland Declaration of Rights, and federal claims alleging false arrest, false imprisonment, and battery.

On May 15, 2018, Officer Florio responded to a call for service at an elementary school in Baltimore City related to a disruptive person outside of the school that had led to a school lockdown. Plaintiff, who was a minor, was attempting to pick up his younger sibling from school, but school officials denied his request and asked him to leave. When Officers arrived, including Officer Florio, Plaintiff continued to pace in the street while yelling for his brother and at the police.

Officer Florio repeatedly asked Plaintiff to leave the scene and advised that his parents needed to pick his sibling up. After Plaintiff yelled back at Officer Florio and stepped towards him, Officer Florio utilized his Taser on Plaintiff. The taser caused a physical injury that required surgical care.

In order to resolve this case, avoiding the expense, time, and uncertainties of further protracted litigation and the potential for an excess judgment, BPD and the City agreed to offer Plaintiff \$500,000.00 for a complete settlement of the case. In 2019, years after Plaintiff completed his sentence, the Baltimore City State's Attorney's Officer filed a Motion to Vacate Plaintiff's Conviction, "in the interest of justice and fairness," based solely a statement by convicted GTTF officer Momodu Gondo that he had worked in a prior unit with Officer Giordano and that the unit had stolen money from suspects and distributed it amongst the unit members. The Motion to Vacate did not assert or suggest that the arresting officers violated any laws in their handling of Bass's 2010 arrest and conviction. In order to resolve this case, avoiding the expense, time, and uncertainties of further protracted litigation and the potential for an excess judgment, BPD and the City agreed to offer Plaintiff a settlement payment of \$310,000.00, for the complete settlement of the case. In return, Plaintiff Bass has agreed to dismiss his lawsuit against all Defendants.

The Department of Law respectfully requests authorization to approve the settlement of a lawsuit brought by the Plaintiff, James Handley, against Defendant, the Baltimore Police Department ("BPD"). Plaintiff alleged discrimination and retaliation based on his race and gender against the Defendant.

Plaintiff is a former Major within BPD, who separated employment in 2020. Prior to his departure, he filed suit against BPD, alleging that he was subject to discrimination based on his gender (male) and race (Caucasian), and that he was retaliated against both for engaging in protected activity and due to his race.

According to Plaintiff, the majority of the conduct occurred when Darryl DeSousa was with the Agency. Prior to DeSousa being named Police Commissioner, Plaintiff was promoted by then-Commissioner Kevin Davis to the rank of "Acting Inspector." When DeSousa became Commissioner, Plaintiff's title and rank were revoked, and he was returned to the rank of Major. In addition, Plaintiff was transferred from the Recruitment Unit to a District, and he claims that DeSousa systematically removed other Caucasian officers from Command-level positions. He also claims that, in February 2018, DeSousa and many other BPD members were present for a "Commissioner's Call to Accountability" meeting. At this meeting, DeSousa stated that the BPD suffered from "PMS," which he then explained meant that BPD suffered from being too "Pale, Male, Stale." DeSousa stated that he wanted to diversify the BPD, and Plaintiff claims that DeSousa's replacement of Caucasians with African-Americans at the Command-level staff demonstrates that DeSousa was discriminating against Caucasians. Plaintiff claims that he was subsequently involuntarily transferred several more times by DeSousa.

In order to resolve this case, avoiding the expense, time, and uncertainties of further protracted litigation and the potential for an excess judgment, BPD agreed to offer Plaintiff a settlement payment of \$75,000.00, for a complete settlement of the case. In return, Plaintiff has agreed to dismiss his lawsuit against Defendants.

The above-referenced litigation stems from an automobile collision at or near the intersection of Ensor and Monument Streets which occurred on December 3, 2019. At the time of the incident, Plaintiff alleges that she was rear-ended while stopped at a traffic light by a BPD patrol vehicle being driven by Officer Brendan Brown. Photos showed significant damage to the rear of Ms. Sauls' vehicle. Ms. Sauls had a passenger in her vehicle. Plaintiff Sauls suffered an injury to her lumbar spine, which an examining doctor has described as permanent. She has required physical therapy because of the incident.

It would be difficult for the City to dispute liability in this matter. Rear-end collisions are notoriously difficult to defend, especially to a jury. A jury is likely to sympathize with Plaintiff Sauls, as the impact of the collision appears to have been significant. Plaintiff has medical bills totaling over \$15,000. These damages coupled with her supported claim of permanency and her young age, when taken together, expose the City to a potential unfavorable verdict higher than the requested settlement amount.

In order to resolve this litigation economically and to avoid the expense, time, and uncertainties of further protracted litigation, the City has agreed to offer Plaintiff payment of \$80,000 for complete settlement of the case in return for dismissal of the claim against the City. BACKGROUND/EXPLANATION:

Pursuant to Ordinance 20-437, dated December 2, 2020, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore authorized the acquisition by purchase or condemnation of 4 temporary construction easements and a perpetual easement in the fee simple interest in the descriptive property known as the south side of Waterview Avenue, rear of 2200-2208 Round Road (Ward 25, Section 05, Block 7610, Lot 019) which will facilitate the repair and stabilization of the downstream slope on the property. The Owner and the City were unable to agree on a purchase price.

It is necessary that the City, with the prior approval of the Board of Estimates, institute a condemnation action and deposit with the Clerk of the Court of the appropriate jurisdiction in Baltimore City the fair market value of the property interest being acquired. The City obtained 2 independent appraisals in August of 2021. The highest appraisal valued the temporary construction easements and a perpetual easement in the amount of \$23,200.00. This will permit the City to acquire by condemnation the temporary construction easements and a perpetual easement in the subject property in conformity with the requirements of the applicable law as shown on Plat RW 20-36410.

The downstream slope near 2340 Seamon Avenue is heavily eroded and the existing storm drain pipe has suffered structural failure. Seamon Avenue has experienced settlement as a result of the eroded slope. In addition, an existing channel crosses under Waterview Avenue, via a culvert, which discharges to the Middle Branch of the Patapsco River. The cross culvert under Waterview Avenue is a 42-inch diameter pipe and is currently filled with sediment from the upstream pipe.

Public Works

To mitigate these failures, the slope upstream of the storm drain outfall must be repaired through geotechnical stabilization. The existing storm drain system, including inlets and the failed pipes, shall be replaced. Downstream of the existing headwall a Regenerative Step Pool Storm Conveyance (SPSC) must be installed to treat stormwater before crossing through the existing culvert under Waterview Avenue. SPSC systems are open-channel conveyance structures that convert, through surface pools and a sand seepage filter, storm flow to shallow groundwater flow. These systems are designed to safely convey and treat water quality storm events. The typical SPSC configuration to be used for this project consists of a series of shallow aquatic pools, riffle grade controls, native vegetation, and an underlying sand/woodchip mix filter medium. The City of Baltimore, DPW is advancing the SPSC design to achieve water quality treatment for Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) credit to meet the requirements outlined in the City of Baltimore Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit.

The proposed improvements for this project shall consist of the slope repair, a forebay that will treat the one-inch Water Quality Volume. After the forebay, a cascade and a series of eight (8) riffles and pools will be installed.

The current condition of the outfall and side slopes located at 2300 Seamon Avenue is poor and without rehabilitation and stabilization, the slopes will continue to erode and undermine Seamon Avenue eventually causing the road to collapse. This rehabilitation and stabilization will be a two-part process. First, the existing outfall structure will be repaired, and the geotechnical stabilization of the slope will be performed. Second, an SPSC will be installed downstream of the outfall structure. This BMP, through surface pools and sand seepage filter, will convert concentrated storm runoff to shallow groundwater flow.
